Closing Date:

Friday 28th April but late entries may be accepted at the organiser's discretion. All entries must be made on an official Entry Form (one per horse/pony) and must include a **LARGE** stamped self addressed envelope. First class stamp is recommended as the Monday after closing date is a Bank Holiday, large letter stamps if you are riding both days. Entry forms are available on the group website www.endurancebgne Yorkshire.co.uk (one entry form/day if you are riding both days and please write "**BOTH DAYS**" on the back of SAE or send an SAE for an entry form to the organiser

Distances: Saturday: Class 1 – 10km Class 2 – 16km Class 3 – 23km
Sunday: Class 1 -24km (15 miles) Class 2 – 32km (20 miles)

Maximum of 45 riders per day you may ride either or both days.

Camping and Corralling:

This will be available on Saturday night at the venue by kind permission of The Fox Inn. There will be bar meals available to purchase on Saturday night as well as the A la Carte menu.

The cost for Corralling £12/horse, Camping £5 and Caravan £10.00. If you are interested in camping and corralling (you will need your own corralling equipment) Please complete the corralling and camping booking form.

Catering:

There will not be a catering van, instead on the Saturday and Sunday there will be cake and refreshments available, raising funds for the **Great North Air Ambulance**. There will also be a tombola on both days.

The Fox Inn is opening specially at 5 pm Saturday for bar meals at our request (so even people going home can eat).

The Fox Inn will also open up on the Sunday morning so we can purchase some breakfast butties and a warm drink.

On Sunday lunch time The Fox does roast lunches and they have kindly agreed to have a selection of sandwiches available to purchase for riders and their crew.

There is 1 stable available at £20

The Fox Inn now has 2 b and b rooms 1 king £70 and 1 dble £60 per room to include full English. Please book the room direct with the Fox Inn.

Start Times:

Saturday 2.00pm – 3.30pm **Sunday** 9.15am – 10.30pm

Route on Saturday:

The short route is on quiet lanes and mostly on moorland tracks however the long route has an extra loop of single track lanes. The Saturday route does NOT cross the A171.

Route on Sunday:

Mainly farm tracks, moorland and quiet country roads. There will be a crossing of the A171 on the way out and on the way back to the venue but this will be manned at all times.

Change of Class:

Please note that in accordance with EGB rules riders may not change to a higher distance on the day of the ride. However, they may downgrade to a lower distance before the start of the ride. In this case, it is the rider's responsibility to notify the Ride Organiser and/or Ride Secretary before they start the Ride.

Facilities:

Communications, First Aid, Vet on call and Outside Toilet.

Entry Fees:

EGB and Associate Members: £15.00

Non Members: £23.00 includes a fee for EGB day membership to comply with insurance

Please note: £1 discount for young rides (14-21) and £3 discount for juniors (8-13)

Misc:

Maximum speed 16km/hr average. Please try to maintain average speed of 8km/hr. All horses successfully completing will be awarded a rosette and their Group kilometers.

Dogs must be on short leads and under strict control at the venue and are only allowed on the parts of the course that are a public right of way. Please note the Saturday route crosses private land and **NO DOGS** are allowed on these sections of the route There are some nice footpaths from the venue where your crew can walk their dogs, so long as they are on a short lead. These paths are on the ride maps.

Rules:

This ride is run under Endurance GB Rules.

Non-members may obtain a copy of the Competitive Reference Book details from Ride Organiser

Save for the death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the organisers or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the Organisers of any event to which these rules apply, nor the Endurance GB, nor any agent, employee or representative of these bodies accepts any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, land or any other person or property whatsoever whether caused by their negligence, breach of contract or any other way whatsoever.

RESERVATION OF RIGHT - the Organiser has the right to cancel the ride or any class, alter the advertised times, refuse any entry.

The Organiser/Organising Committee of this event has taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the Organiser/Organising Committee and all Officials and Stewards.

AGE LIMITS:

- Horse or Pony to be 4 years or over.
- Riders must be 8 years or over.
- Rider's aged 8–13 must be accompanied by an adult (over 18 years) at all times, one adult to two junior riders.

DEPOSIT - of £5.00 (refunded) or EGB membership card must be given to the secretary to obtain number bib to be worn for the ride.

SAFETY:

All Riders When Mounted Must Wear Properly Secured Riding Hats To Standards , see entry form for information.

IMPORTANT PLEASE NOTE STANDARDS ARE CHANGING AND SOME HATS ARE NOW OBSOLETE.

Remember to see the timekeeper when you start and when you finish the ride.

ROUTE MARKING:

Will be with a mixture of orange day-glo tape, spray paint arrows and moor land flags.

GENERAL POINTS:

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- Horses that kick must display a red ribbon in the tail.**
- Novice Horses are advised to wear a green ribbon in the tail.**
- If your horse is a novice and kicks put both ribbons in.**
- Stallions should wear two blue stallion discs on their bridle and a blue tail ribbon, plus a blue ribbon on the breastplate. Your stallion is then easily identified by other riders.**
- No spurs allowed
- No wellington boots.
- Shoes should have a ½ inch heel or that your stirrups have cages.
- WHIPS no longer than 75cm
- Riders please ask permission to overtake others in plenty of time, give a wide berth and do not canter past.
- Remember Stallions do compete in this sport.
- Always display your number bib clearly for marshals to see.
- Be polite to the general public – they may be the Farmer whose land you are on.
- Always walk when passing pedestrians.
- Take care to leave all gates as you find them (open or closed)
- Headcams are not permitted.
- Use your map to anticipate turns as this reduces your chances of getting lost.
- Leave all vehicles locked and valuables out of sight at all times.
- Lead rein entrants should be led by an adult on foot.

HEALTH & SAFETY:

Please be very aware of your surroundings be it at either the venue or out on the ride.

Because of the high profile of Health & Safety/Risk Assessments within Industry and all Sports etc, we must be seen to be acting responsibly. A list will be displayed at all events.
